In the last fiscal year 2022/2023, Carefirst has continued to make strides in providing quality integrated health and community care for over 27,000 clients annually with our team of over 500 professional and front-line staff and 700 volunteers. As the fiscal year came to an end, it was time as an organization to conduct the agency-wide program evaluations and prepare program plans as we look forward to the upcoming fiscal year. In February 2023 and March 2023, all Directors and operational staff gathered for team building, evaluation, and service planning. Each Department presented evaluations and plans

reflecting on its strategic priorities, program activities, objectives, outputs, indicators, challenges, areas for improvement, and outcomes. These retreats illuminated the positive impact that the organization has had in its past year of expansion and resiliency. It also allowed our Association the chance to analyze greater opportunities and be better prepared to meet challenges. Having the chance to come together and brainstorm meaningful solutions means we can now face the next year well planned and ready to implement.

SOCIAL PRESCRIBING PROJECT

Building Neighborhoods of Care

Seniors across Ontario experienced a significant loss of social and community connection through the COVID-19 Pandemic. According to StatCan 2022, 46% of older adults reported being very concerned regarding their physical, mental and social health due to isolation and delayed care. Social Prescribing connects patients to a wide range of non-clinical services in the community based on identified social needs to improve their health and well-being.

Carefirst is pleased to announce that our Association is moving forward on our Social Prescribing Program with gracious funding from United Way of Greater Toronto and New Horizons for Seniors. Carefirst's objective is to establish a Care Pathway, implement early identification and intervention of potential "seniors at risk", refer the right services at the right time, build neighborhoods of care, and create a model development of the Social Prescribing Program.





The Social Prescribing Pathway will involve a prescriber to recognize a client's needs to refer them to social prescribing. A navigator will collaboratively offer social prescriptions by connecting the client to appropriate non-clinical community based supports and peer seniors to support the client. Through the Social Prescribing Program, Carefirst hopes to achieve improved well-being of our seniors, reduced silos of care, and improved diverse determinants of health. It will leverage our High Priority Communities Strategy Program's web of existing agency partnerships alongside Carefirst Senior's pre-existing partnerships to facilitate a robust referral program targeting the clients who need it most. Carefirst is pleased to help pioneer a new way of aging in place in the GTA region.

Essential Components



Client: An older adult who is experiencing social and health barriers and challenges, social isolation with limited social support.



Prescriber: A prescriber (e.g. family physician) who recognizes the impact of social determinants on a client's health and refers them using social prescribing.



Navigator & Peer Seniors: A navigator who receives the referrals and works collaboratively with the client to connect them to appropriate non-clinical community based supports. The clients will be supported by peer seniors.



Social Prescriptions: Non-medical and co-created supports in the community.



Service partners: Provide social program, e.g. wellness centers/social clubs, to form network of "social programs" Organizations from different sectors that are healthcare/social services/grass-root organizations / settlement service.



Carefirst is very excited for the development of a 21st century, state-of-the-art Campus of Care at 9893 Leslie Street, Richmond Hill approved by the Ontario Ministry of Long-Term care to be completed by 2025. Our goal is to raise

\$7.5 million

to support the construction of the \$76 million capital project.



Did you know that by 2041, age 65+ is projected to represent 25% of the total population? In Ontario, there are close to 32,000 individuals on the waitlist for Long Term Care homes, says the Ontario Long Term Care Association. Campus of Care will address the shortcomings of existing long-term care homes through providing integrated social and health care services and programs in a well-coordinated manner.

The Campus will include:

- A Long-term Care Home 120 beds for seniors/individuals with special needs
- A Medical Center primary care/specialist care clinics for 10,000 patients
- A Social Community Hub social programs and home support services
- A Community Kitchen/Cafeteria
- A Community Garden for all age cohorts
- A Music/Dance Studio and Multipurpose Room sports, recreation activities, cultural shows and exhibitions
- Assisted Living Units 36 Life Lease units with on-site support services for older adults age 65+
