We are currently seeking a **Registered Practical Nurse** to join our Adult Day Program.

Responsibilities:

- Assist in the coordination of all essential services in the provision of the Adult Day Program
- Conduct intake and assessment with clients; receive, review, and process referrals within and beyond the agency
- Provide health-related education to program participants, and coordinate the delivery of health-related services (i.e., foot care, nutritional counseling, physiotherapy, medication administration)
- Participate in case conferences and/or weekly rounds; monitor and review the progress of services/care for program participants
- Train and supervise Personal Support Workers for medication management according to established protocols
- Provide timely and informative reports as directed, including periodical program reports and statistics for the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care
- Delivers all services in a professional manner and according to established guidelines and policies
- Ensure compliance with safety rules and procedures to prevent injury and ensure client safety

Requirements:

- Degree/Diploma in Nursing, and a current member of the College of Nurses of Ontario in good standing
- Current membership with the Registered Nurses Association of Ontario
- 2 years of recent clinical experience in the health care sector, experience in a community/primary health care setting is an asset
- Valid First Aid & CPR certification
- Knowledge of community resources for provision of health promotion and chronic disease management and prevention
- Experience in developing, implementing, monitoring and evaluating health promotion programs and activities preferred
- Demonstrated group facilitation skills
- Superior time management and organization skills, with ability to handle high volumes of activity
- Outstanding clinical skills with good judgement in assessment and problem solving
- Ability to build positive relationships with clients, families, volunteers, and community stakeholders
- Fluent in English; proficiency in a second language that reflects the community served, such as Cantonese, is an asset
- A valid vulnerable sector police record check completed within one year
